Cambridge junior squad beat Manitoba for national championship

The Cambridge Turbos Junior AA ringette team were the top team in the nation in 1995-96.

The Turbos, led by coaches Glen Gaudet and Paul Cowlen, had a star-studded team that season. They competed in seven invitational tournaments that year,

emerging with three champiopnships, as well as two silver and two bronze finishes.

Following their successful regular season the Turbos followed up with a gold medal at the Ontario Provincial Championships, earning them the right to represent Ontario at the National Championships in Gloucester, Ontario.
